VNA Health Care opens new health center at 1400 Indian Avenue on the east side of Aurora

VNA Health Care began seeing patients at its new health center at 1400 Indian Avenue in Aurora on November 21.

“In 2012 VNA had its busiest year ever, caring for more than 26,000 patients at our Highland Avenue clinic in Aurora,” says Linnea Windel, President and CEO of VNA Health Care. “And yet Aurora has another 32,000 low income residents who are not being served by a community health center.”

Knowing that number is greater than the capacity of the Highland Avenue location, VNA decided to build a second clinic on the east side of Aurora. Like VNA’s seven other community health centers, this site is designated as a Federally Qualified Health Center to provide services to the medically underserved. VNA received approval to expand in Aurora from the Bureau of Primary Health Care, part of the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) of the United States Department of Health and Human Services. However, VNA has not received any government funding to pay for the expansion.

The new health center is 11,000 square feet and has 22 exam rooms.
